Around-County Race November 9-11

It's For Both Sailing and Power Boats!

The "Around the County" Race will be held beginning Friday, November 9 with an evening rendezvous at the Blakely Island Marina. The race, which begins early on Saturday at the Lydia Shoal buoy just east of Peavine Pass, sees the sailors race around the Islands that make up Island County. Saturday night they'll lay over at Roche Harbor, with the race ending on Sunday.

Power Boaters participate in several ways. They are asked, where able, to provide one or more berths at Blakely Island and at Roche Harbor on Friday and Saturday nights for sailing crew members. In return, the sailing fleet picks up the moorage costs for the power boaters, and provides meals for their "mother ships".

There is also an informal predicted log race just for fun, which this year will be coordinated by **Joe Coons** (call 739-1528 to get details). This event lets the "stinkpotters" brush up their navigation skills by plotting their course along a specific route from Bellingham to Blakely to Roche, and predicting their times for each leg and the total race. In essence, the best predictor wins, gathering unpredictable prizes . . .

At Roche Harbor, the host clubs have arranged for a dinner ... an event famous for fun as the sailors unwind and swap happy — or horror — stories.

Editorial

My column this month is kind of a potpourri of items:

Okay, so the Mariners lost! But the ALCS *did* give us a chance to see what our new lounge could do for the Club, as each day folks stopped in for pop and snacks and the camaraderie of their Club. It was a fun respite from the workday, if even for just a few minutes. . .

On the subject of the new lounge, you should know that our license application is moving on through Olympia, and we *really do* expect to have it soon.

In the meantime, our improvements continue. Following Board approval, **Dick Johnson** has awarded contracts to Andgar Corporation and Louis Glass for the two new furnaces and for new insulating windows on the main floor (about half the windows' initial cost

was offset by smaller furnaces, and they will quickly save the rest in heating bills.)

The Club's **Audit Committee** including **John Gargett, Marlene Bolster, Loraine Boland** and me (with **Ray Nelson** sitting in) reviewed the accounts for the year ended September 30, 2001, and found that "*the financial reporting and accounting procedures are in good shape*".

The committee's report is pending, upon the report of **Bev Dawes**, who is our CPA that is now preparing our annual (2001) tax returns.

Incidentally, the Club books before any adjustments by Dawes show a small profit for the year just ended, before accounting for the loss on the **Breakwater Restaurant's** bankruptcy.

Hey, You: Dues Are Due!

The Bills sent out by the Club in September for annual dues are now due! In fact, after November first, you'll be using up your "grace period" if you haven't paid. Under the By-Laws, you will be dropped if your dues aren't in by the end of November.

According to **Marlene Bolster**, Rear Commodore and Treasurer, it's a great saving to the Club and its volunteers if you follow through on payment. "Prompt-paying Members save us postage, paper and effort", says Bolster. "And, of course, you'll get your new Membership Card by return mail".

According to **Joe Coons** (who keeps the books), only three members so far have elected to pay dues in installments; all the rest have paid in full for the coming twelve months, a statistic that over joys him! "It saves us postage, and me, work. I Love it!", he says (but he says he still accepts installments).

As your new Fleet Captain, I want to report to you on the current status and future goals envisioned for the BYC fleet. I'm the first to realize that the unethical election practices of my opponent is the only reason I was elected, but I want to emphasize "fun on the water" anyway! I'm proud to serve with other dedicated members who have one primary goal, which is to improve the Bellingham Yacht Club.

The Junior Sailing program is growing rapidly. We have approximately 30 juniors enrolled and **Gary Baker** has done a fantastic job with the program during the last year. He again has accepted the challenge of guiding the program this year! We have recently acquired a new floating shed, which is now located on the inside of our dock in front of the club. The shed will provide important storage for the junior sailors and allow us to have our racing buoys next to our mark boat for Wednesday night races. Junior sailors will also enjoy the opportunity of having access to a larger keel boat this year. A red C&C 24 has been donated to the junior program and is moored in front of the

club. We should look for ways to increase the number and maybe some day we can have our own fleet of one design keel boats that juniors can race and active members can checkout!

Quinn Selsor has graciously agreed to take on the duties of Power Fleet Captain. He would welcome hearing from volunteers or those willing to share ideas. Some of the sailors have been floating the idea of a fishing derby, which allows for an "under sail" division, but we will have to wait to see if members are interested.

Joe Bartlett has once again agreed to be Sailing Fleet Captain. Joe worked hard last year to improve the quality of sailing for BYC sailors and should be thanked by everyone. Thanks to Joe our Points Roberts Race was revamped to allow racers to stay overnight in Point Roberts Harbor. This was very successful last year and we hope to expand the participation to Anacortes boats and include BYC power boats in the harbor activities this year. We now have the ability to post results on our Web site quickly.

Recently, the Board supported the idea of placing a flag pole at Inati Bay

and we will try to organize a dedication party in early Spring. Do you have any ideas?

As a sailor and Fleet Captain I want you to know that I will be asking you to join me in trying to reach the goal of a 100 boat entry level in PITCH this year. We have seen a decline in the number of participants in past years, but by focusing on one-design fleets, cruising classes, junior sailors, CYC and Club racers, I believe with your help, we could succeed. We are going to have to start planning early and that's one of those opportunities to volunteer!

The Annual Gift Idea Column

Each year before the holidays I've tried to give you some ideas for your Christmas list. For top-of-the-line ideas, see any of the dealers listed on our back page and order a new boat! But if that's a little over your budget, here are some other ideas:

Gadgets:

A wind speed/direction monitor: New digital units on the market cost about 30% less than the older designs. Though not cheap, this is a near-essential on sailboats, and a great luxury on powerboats. Just think: You'll be able to accurately boast about the winds on the Bay!

A 460MHz EPIRB: What a great safety device. Much less prone to false alarms, this would be great for any offshore boater, or participant in Swiftsure. . .

Great Safety Gifts:

Inflatable Lifevests: Many are now USCG approved, and they are light and comfortable. Isn't it time you *always* wore one in your dinghy or rougher water?

New personal locator whistles made in Bellingham: Give your boating buddy one of these less-than \$5 whistles with a shoelace-lanyard or chain to wear when on the boat, to blow if overboard. Just good sense.

Boat Maintenance Gifts:

New Lettering: Replace those beat up old graphics. Call Special-T for ideas that will really spruce her up!

A good Tool Kit: If your boat has old, rusty, or insuffi-

cient tools, why not one of the good all-round kits from West Marine, Sears or Home Base? Check to see if the boat's engine uses Metric or SAE measures and buy accordingly.

Waterproof, Shock-absorbing Flashlights and a supply of Batteries: There are never too many on a boat!

A Supply of Replacement Bulbs and Fuses: Look around the boat at each light and get the bulb number. Check the fuses for sizes. Then buy spares from Rasmussens, LFS, or Redden and package them in a "gift box" from the fly-tackle section of K-Mart or Wal-Mart.

No-Cash-Required Gifts:

Certificates for free wash jobs or wash-and-wax jobs: The kids can give the boater in the family one (or more) of these and give the skipper the experience of being like Paul Allen.
