The Second Annual New Year's Gourmet Cruise is scheduled for Saturday, December 29, 2001 to Tuesday, January 1, 2002, although last year some cruisers only came one or two of the three nights.

According to Joe Coons, Chairman, Saturday will be at Fisherman Bay on Lopez Island, Sunday at Cap Sante Marina at Anacortes, then New Year's Eve at LaConner. "By going to Anacortes and LaConner, folks can come by car if they wish or if the weather is bad," said Coons.

Specific plans are for dinners at three excellent restaurants, the *Bay Café* at Lopez, *Bella Isola* in Anacortes, and *The Lighthouse* on New Year's Eve. Editorial

What a great turnout we had for the **bartender certificate training** on Thursday, November 15! Some 30 members completed the seminar and will be getting their cards from the state in a week or so. It's great to see our Members getting so involved . . .

Meanwhile, if you haven't been to the Club to see our new Club House Bar and Lounge, make it a point to stop in!

Speaking of the Bar and Lounge, it was fun attending the revived **Tom and Jerry Party** on the day before Thanksgiving. Best guesses are that about 80 Members attended, and all had a good time; equally important, our Members enjoyed a convivial, cheerful atmosphere without the time becoming an alcoholic wipeout as it sometimes did in the "old days". We had good food, too!

I keep the Club's books, and you should know that the Club's annual tax return has been completed by **Bev Dawes, CPA**. Bev also reviews our purchases and disposals of assets, and adjusts our depreciation schedules and other postings as necessary. After all was done for

the year ended September 30, 2001, we had a loss of \$34,201. The causes: A \$24,704 loss on the Breakwater's bankruptcy, and a "tax write-off" of \$9,479 in real estate commissions that we were amortizing on the books from almost six year ago. The latter was only an accounting correction, and required no cash. . .

Surprisingly, your "equity" in the Club only dropped about \$11,000 to a total of \$130,000, and that's because we spent a chunk on

improvements, and those two wonderful anonymous Members gave us the new Mark Boat and motor.

That Equity of \$130,000 is based upon the "historic" value of all of our building and equipment of just \$299,000. The building, for example, after our depreciation allowance, is on the books for only about \$299,000; except the mark boat, everything else we own in the way of equipment and furnishing is depreciated to nearly zero.

On October 1, we had \$26,000 in our bank and savings accounts although we paid out over \$25,000 in building repairs and improvements to the decks and interior during the last 60 days of the year. And our mortgage is not only current, but was reduced to \$156,000, a \$13,400 drop from last year.

Reciprocal News

Capt. Homie

Every year I like to spend from mid-September to mid December down in South Puget Sound. Using reciprocals at the numerous yacht clubs down in SPS allows me to cruise this area, visit with many of the people that I meet in my travels, and my average monthly moorage costs are between \$30-50 per month. Affordable, Aye. Plus when you come down here, be low on fuel. On November 15th Ballard oil was selling Diesel for 85 cents a gallon! That was the price for 175-350 gallons. So what you do is come on down to the locks, go into the lake, top-off your tanks, and then the fun really begins. Ballard oil is on your port side, right when you come out of the locks as you're going from salt to fresh water. Then not more than 500ft away is a dock (no power, but FREE), a city dock that you can tie-up on. Now you're in the Lake, and you have seven or more yacht clubs with which the Bellingham YC has reciprocal privileges.

My three favorites are Seattle YC, Queen City YC, and Meydenbauer Bay YC. They all speak very highly of BYC, and I've found that to be the case almost everywhere I go. (So whatever we're doing, it must be good.)

I love it when a member of the yacht club that I'm visiting comes down and says Hello. I sure hope we all have enough time to stop and introduce ourselves, answer questions, and maybe meet someone that we get a chance to meet again out on the water. It is a small Ocean, you know. Now that I've gotten over my shyness, it sure takes me a lot longer to go somewhere. So many people to stop and visit along the way. Being the Director of Cruzin & Shmuzin and head of maintenance (not just another pretty face) on the MV CAROLINE requires me to stop and visit along the way.

I must mention that many yacht clubs limit the number of boats per yacht club, so maybe this

is an adventure that is best done with no more than two boats, plus they only have limited space anyway. During the week, Monday-Friday, I seldom have any boats from other yacht clubs that I compete with for space. Even many of the later-in-the-year weekends are pretty good.

After you've had enough of the lake, head on out of the Locks and hang a left (port). South you'll find Des Moines YC directly across from Pt. Robinson. Best to call ahead of time, because it's a bit tight back there. Kinda like the BYC. So if BYC doesn't scare you DMYC shouldn't either.

Next is the Tacoma YC. This is my favorite Yacht Club Building. Very, very nice, and TYC also happens to be one of the finest restaurants in all of Tacoma.

From there it's either down thru the Narrows, or up to Quartermaster

YC (North end of Quartermaster Harbor). Glenn McCormick, the caretaker, is certainly a nice fella, and very helpful. Bus service can be had to downtown Vashon. This place is very protected from big winds. And for a last shot at fresh crab, drop a pot off the red entrance buoy, and pick it up the next day. That's the last good spot for crabbing as you head South in Puget Sound.

Don't wait for slack water at the Narrows. Catch that maximum flood and enjoy watching the GPS tell how fast you're going. Day Island YC (portside), maybe a mile south of the Narrows, is fun, but Homie don't play that unless he has 8 feet of tide or more. When going in you can't be too far to Starboard. I mean you're right up against those boathouses! DIYC reciprocal dock is almost as big as ours. The caretaker is super. Within walking distance north is a good pub, also close by is a small chandlery. The bus that takes you up the hill, will take you to a Liquor or Grocery Store, whichever is of need. Lots of other stuff up there too.

Tacoma has an excellent Transit System (that's coming from an ex-Seattle bus driver, me!)

Next month we go farther South.
