## 2002 Opening Day A Success, After All!

With threatening weather doing its best to put a damper on the festivities, the annual BUC Opening Day festivities went off smoothly, after all, with some 40 boats joining the annual parade in spite of earlier rain and dire predictions from the sooth-sayers.

The pre-ceremony cocktail party, held in the Sapphire Cove dining room at the Club drew a standing-room-only crowd as Members and guests enjoyed complimentary appetizers, and soft beverages. Then the crowd stayed on hand for the ceremonies which were held inside, and capably chaired by Commodore Callery. Father John Gibbs gave the Blessing of the Fleet.

After the parade and early parties, about 150 folks came back to the Clubhouse for a drawing of gift baskets (one of which held \$100) and a beautiful hand-made quilt that raised funds for the Juniors. A total of over \$950 was raised. A dance followed until about 11:30PM.

## Here's the Customs Scoop

A group of BYC boaters with CANPASSes went to Ganges on Saltspring Island the weekend on May 24 and all encountered exactly the same experience. When we called in for a clearance, we were asked the usual questions and were given a clearance number. We then were required to go on to a regular international entry point (in our case, it was Bedwell Harbor) where we went to the Customs officer and showed a picture ID (for us, our passports). We then were immediately given a sticker for our window (no waiting at all) and went on to Ganges.

The Canpass check-in did help a lot in expediting things; other boaters without a Canpass were going through much more tedious processes at Bedwell.

Upon return to the U.S., but while still at sea, we contacted U.S. Customs by phone using the usual 800 number. We used our PIN number, and were given a clearance; the officer then changed our PIN number to one that he said would be easier to remember. It was no problem at all.

A note to those handling Customs matters: I keep a three-ring notebook on the boat with a "Customs" page. Here I note my vessel number, PIN numbers, phone numbers, etc., and log every transit's information including date, clearance number, passengers aboard, etc. In this way, if the agencies lose a clearance number, I still have it carefully recorded. This sheet saves a lot of scrambling when I make the calls. — Joe Coons

## Editorial

Last month we published the financial reports for the Club, and I hope you took a minute to read them. They showed that our Club has not only recovered from the failure/bankruptcy of the Breakwater Restaurant last year, it is achieving new levels of member growth and profitability.

During May, we reached another milestone in the Club's business success with the completion of the new heating-ventilating-air conditioning systems at the Club. This project, with a total cost in excess of \$50,000, will bring new comfort to our facilities both for our Members and for patrons and staff at Emerald Bay Events' Sapphire Cove operation in the building. It also will save EBE on utilities, as the new units can be better controlled for cost-saving, and are more efficient.

You'll read more about this in

the Building and House report on the page opposite.

*It is amazing that we have been thus able to complete over \$100,000 in improvements and repairs, and sustain over a \$25,000 loss due to the Breakwater bankruptcy, and yet have increased our mortgage by no more than \$70,000 — and we haven't used all of that available funding yet!* In addition, our new mortgage arrangement carries payments no higher than before, due to lower interest.

This successful funding of a big transaction for your Club is the result of careful work by the Board of Trustees, the Officers, the Build-

ing and House Committee, and the time and patience to get good advice, get competing bids on everything, and the courage to *get it done, now.*

## BOATYARD TO OPEN

Boaters will have a new full-service boatyard this summer. The Port of Bellingham has approved a 10-year lease with Seaview North at Squalicum Harbor to operate a full-service boatyard at the former Weldcraft site by our Club.

Seaview North will offer professional boat maintenance services and will provide space for "do-it-yourself" work, and should begin operation about July using a Marine Travelift to haul out boats up to 35 tons and will add a 100-ton lift once the Port completes necessary waterside improvements. Seaview anticipates making more than \$1 million in shoreside improvements.

Seaview Boatyards is a well-known boatyard operator in the Puget Sound area with two boatyards in Seattle. Their CEO has been an industry pioneer in working with the Department of Ecology and industry groups in the development of environmental performance standards for boatyards. Seaview North will be the third boatyard on Bellingham Bay.

## Greeters Organized

At the Board we've discussed the need for volunteers to take on the responsibility for greeting and introducing new members of the BYC. Board members adopted the following plan:

Upon acceptance of a member, the application is routed to the New Member Greeters who note selected information and either take, or ask another member to take, the role of welcoming the new member, taking into consideration common interests between new member and greeter.

Then the greeter calls the member and welcomes them to an upcoming event such as F @ F; introduce the new members to as many older members as possible at such an event; and offers to answer any questions about functions, procedures, volunteering (such as bar tender) etc.

It is expected that this "Big Brother/Big Sister" assignment would last for about 3 months or until the new member had been introduced and feels comfortable in participating as they wish.
