Land/Scavenger Cruise Report

Almost 40 people enjoyed this one day event!

After a knot tying test at Waypoint #1, sealed instructions were handed out. The waypoint at Boundary Bay Brewery was a popular lunch spot, with the next sealed envelope handed out containing more items to be scavenged and a knowledge quiz about boating terms and local circumstances.
