## Members of the Month

This month I'm saluting **our Past Commodores!**

You may not realize it, but the Past Commodores of our Club are big boosters of our BYC!

Past Commodores pay no dues, a tradition that began many years ago to offset the huge cost, and time, that goes into their job during their five years of "going through the chairs" at our Club. But beginning a number of years ago, the PC's founded a local chapter of *The International Order of the Blue Gavel*, an organization of PC's around the world, and began collecting funds to help out the BYC. Many of the PC's contribute to this fund, often an amount equivalent to, or even more than, the present annual dues. Then, each year, the PC's vote to give the Club money for various projects.

The PC's donate \$2,500 annually for the Inati Bay outstation lease, and \$300 annually to pay out-of-pocket web site costs. They have given more, too: in 2001 they donated \$3,000 for the mirrors on the lounge wall; earlier, they donated our big-screen TV. Traditionally these checks are presented at our Opening Day ceremonies. The P.C.'s also invite the present Commodore to all their meetings to hear reports on the State of the Club and to offer suggestions for the good of the BYC.

Officers of the chapter are P.C. "**Bud**" Peterson, President (a job he's held since its founding); P.C. **Bob Moles**, V.P. (he succeeded **Jerry Main** in this post); and P.C. **Steve Ross**, Secretary. The group meets quarterly, appropriately in the Commodore's Room!

## Plan Now for RVYC Cruise!

Co-Cruising Chair **Quinn Selsor** advises that it is not too early to start thinking about signing up for the Royal Victoria Yacht Club Cruise the last weekend in June. This well-attended annual event takes advantage of the Canadian July 1 "Canada Day". # CAPTAIN HOMIE'S RECIPROCAL CRUISING

*Retired Member Frank Richardson, "Captain Homie", from time to time sends us communiqués...*

I come to the **South Sound** twice a year. (Anything South of Alki Point "South Sound" to me, and it has some of the best Reciprocal.)

**Des Moines Y/C** is nice. Margaret, the caretaker (she and her husband were voted Boating Family of the Year) is usually there to give you a key. Getting thru the gate to your boat is a trip. First the way you have to open the gate means you must use both hands. And when the gate closes as you leave to go up to town, you get a pretty good idea of what the doors sound like at McNeil Island!

**Tacoma Y/C** has a killer Sunday Brunch (they're kind of famous for it). Excellent security. I love listening to the wolves and coyotes singing from over at Pt. Defiance. My little scooter works great when I'm down here; in fact it's great just about everywhere I use it...

**Oro Bay Y/C** was one of the best places that I stayed in South Sound. I met the harbormaster, and he gave me a ride to the Country Store. It's worth seeing, I found out from a local exactly how far it was to the store, 7.2 miles round trip, but often people will offer you a ride. No cops on the Island. Hitch hiking is accepted. The numbers for the combination have never been changed!

At **Quartermaster Y/C** they don't change them either! They repaved the path — a hillside tram would have really been nice, the climb to the road is pretty physical! I did okay with it. Glen McCormick (old Vashon family) is the caretaker. He has a new Cape Cod Cat sailboat that he lives on. Real wide, but lots of room. He's spent a lot of time at sea in his younger days.

I found out that in about 120-140 feet of water, north of the Nisqually Flats are some big crab. And I found two clubs that I'm going to try and get reciprocal with: One is the South Sound Sailing Society. If you stay at Percival Landing, when you fill out the pay envelope you just write in SSSS and they pick up the tab (not sure for how many nights). And **Olympia Y/C** is right next door, fun.

I also learned that April 5th the **Shelton Y/C** has a Oyster-Ham fund raising dinner that I plan to attend. I have some nice friends at Shelton. I'll be presenting them with a BYC Burgee to hang with the rest of their collection. So now I have two reasons, six months apart, to go there. Perfect. I love it when I can add structure to my life, lest I just be wandering around aimlessly.

The **South Sound Cruising Club** has its reciprocal at Swanton Marina (slips 219&221). They have a mail-in-refund-back setup. This is the best place to do laundry South of Bainbridge Island. I never got to check out the crab-spot. The day before they closed the season until????

With my pass for the Marine Parks, \$110, I need 6.8 stays at a dock to get my money's worth — no problem!
