RBAW REPORT

BYC was the host for the Annual Joint Meeting and lunch of RBAW and the Council of BC Yacht Clubs. Over 30 were here in the wardroom on Sat. April 5th for a very successful event.

Issues of concern to boaters discussed included:

- 1. As before, US Customs is requiring that upon return to the USA a decal and PIN must be obtained for the \$25 fee if your boat is over 30 feet. Of course it can be obtained before leaving from the office at the Bellwether customs office. Full info on the program is found at www.customs.ustreas.gov/travel/travel.htm.
- 2. Telephone check-in was suspended during the high terrorism alert period, but is now back on; it changes depending on threat level.
- 3. Due to state budget woes, The Washington State Parks and Recreation Commission is proposing many fee increases and suspension of the annual parks permit in 2004. RBAW and boaters have been responding and the issue is not settled yet.

SPECIAL NEW BAR RULES FOR OPENING DAY

To avoid problems and be in compliance with our private club license with the Washington State Liquor Control Board this is our Opening Day plan:

(1) At 7:00 PM the sign-in table will be moved to the main lobby. *All persons will check in here.* (2) Only BYC members and their guests or reciprocal yacht club members and their guests will be allowed on *either side* of the building. (3) All persons (including members) will be given a plastic bracelet to wear to verify that you have checked in, and won't have to go through the process again. (4) To order a drink, you must be wearing a bracelet. Remember, the bartenders are hired and proba-

bly won't know you. No bracelet...no drink! (5) Minors will have a different color bracelet and may be in our lower lounge (not in the bar area) or in Sapphire Cove. (6) Only BYC members can run a tab and you must give the bartender your card to keep behind the bar; when you reorder, use the name on the tab! (7) You may take your drink from the bar side to the Sapphire Cove, but no where else inside or out.

The sign-in table will be manned by BYC Officers and Trustees, and there will be an off-duty policeman in the lobby. Please help so the shifts can be short.
