Montague Cruise July 26-27

After doing research about Customs concerns (see below), **Chuck & Roberta McCord** have decided to stick with the original plan and go to Montague Harbour as planned in July. The nice little marina can accommodate up to 30 boats and have several restaurant pubs to choose for a nice dinner. There is the Hummingbird Pub that is a short hop away using one of the summer shuttles and the Montague Grill that is right at the marina, who serve steaks, ribs, calm chowder and seafood. And there's *La Berengerie*, if you'd like a full course though informal feast.

If someone enjoys hiking, there's the Provincial Marine Park there, B.C.'s first one; there are more than 130 species of wild birds and many rare and protected plants. For the adventurous, a Canadian fishing license can be purchased for only \$14 for one day or \$26.70 for a three-day weekend...that's Canadian \$! Active or Porlier Pass are some of the best fishing grounds in our area. Call Chuck or Roberta for more info and restaurant preference. Most important now is to reserve moorage, as space is limited, so call early. Talk to Gram at the harbor: 1-250-539-5733. (More details will follow.)
