This new BYTE is rigged with the race package and gives the sailor quite an advantage, as it allows full adjustability of the sail and makes it much easier to make adjustments on the go. Our other BYTES are not equipped the same way, but it is our goal to see that they are before we start our racing season next year.

The cost of this upgrade is substantial. In view of that, we will be looking for sponsors to help offset this cost in exchange for advertisement on our boats, as well as names on a Junior uniform to be displayed at Regattas and around town. If we get sponsors

to donate at least \$250 each, then we only need 2 sponsors per BYTE! These funds go directly to the Juniors boats, and any extra money that comes in will go to future boat purchases. Life Ring Fund Makes A Difference

Assistant Treasurer **Joe Coons** reports that a number of Members of our Club have elected to voluntarily make contributions to the Club's "Life Ring Fund" as was suggested in the recent dues billing.

The Life Ring Fund was created several years ago under the leadership of now - Past Commodore **Karen Callery** to give Members a special way to help their Club. Money contributed to this fund goes to our bank and directly against the Club's mortgage principal balance in the month in which it's contributed, thus it not only reduces our debt, it reduces the amount the Club pays for interest in future months as well!

Donors to the Life Ring Fund are recognized on a plaque by the door to the Club, and are listed in the Club Roster (see page 1A-7).

Recent contributions of over \$2,000 have been added to over \$19,000 collected earlier, thus they have made a big impact on the Club's debt! Fortunately, the Club owes only about \$209,000 on its mortgage which will be fully retired in about 13.5 years; this credit line is secured by the Club's building, which was recently appraised at over \$650,000 (not including all the furniture, fixtures, boats and equipment the Club also owns. After the latest contributions are added, the loan will be under \$207,000...and in these early months of the 15-year note, it drops around another \$8,000 per year in the normal course of business.

Helpful Tip

Just in case your new BYC cap developed a dark stain in front of the sweat band from all the hard work this past hot summer, here is an easy fix to save the cap. Stain the whole brim with "Synthetic Sweat".

To a half of cup of warm water, add a 1/2 teaspoon of salt and a scant teaspoon of cooking oil. To this add a drop of liquid soap or detergent to emulsify the oil. Mix well and brush all over the tan "suede" brim. Let dry, blot if necessary. Now you have a wearable cap with a slightly darker brim than next summer's sweat will not show through.

Once again Homie had a Banana Split at the Telegraph Harbor Marina. Ron & Barbara sure are doing a great job with that place (one of the few places I don't mind paying for moorage). And I spent the first week of June anchored back in False Creek. You can call the Aqua Bus on channel 73, and they will come to your Boat to pick you up, and bring you back. I anchor out in front of Monks Pub when in False Creek. We also have reciprocal with the False Creek YC (one night, free, with 30amp). Don't tie-up under the bridge, or you'll be spending a bit of time cleaning Bird-Droppings. You can spend a week in the Vancouver area, and at the end you would have paid maybe \$15 total for moorage.
