MORE ON OUR LOCAL HISTORY

Excerpts from Who The Hell Was San Juan by Doug Cardle

So Just Who Was San Juan?

He was the Viceroy of New Spain. He was the eponym for at least seven place names in the San Juan Islands, four of which still remain on our charts.

He was Don Juan Vincente de Guemes Pacheco de Padilla Horcasitees y Aguayo, Conde Revilla de Gigedo. He was not, as far as the records show, any kind of saint.

Revilla Gigedo, as he was known for short, took over the job as viceroy in 1789. At this time the Spanish claims in North America had reached their widest extent. He did not see the far Pacific Northwest as being worth what it would cost to hold so he resisted the build up of the army planned by his predecessor. This did not bring him favor from the head man in Madrid.

Most of Gigedos works as viceroy should have brought him more favor than it did. As a great reformer he is ranked among the top 20 or so of the leaders in Mexican history. He did much to clean up the bribery and corruption in the government service as well as seeing to the physical cleaning up of the capital city.

Despite his good works and popularity with the populous, Gigedo lasted only five years in office before losing his job. The rulers in Spain didn't think that Gigedos reformations were all that necessary and handed him his walking papers as soon as they could.

All in all, the Conde Revilla de Gigedo was a worthy eponym for our island group and deserves to be more widely known than he is.

The large or double is only for the real hungry. This is probably their signature dish. It 's the only reason I go there. Ivar's on the Seattle Waterfront has a unique recipe.

Let me tell about Ivar's. Monday thru Friday 3:00pm-7:00pm they have Steamed Mussels, plus some other great stuff on the Hors d'voures list for unbelievably low prices. This is the best food value anywhere. I said the best!

The J&J Seafood House in Pouslbo is also quite good. I love finding great food as I travel. I'm a great eater (Patty told me so).

I was in LaConner Feb 24th when the big winds blew. With the current going one way and wind going the other, they had 2 to 3 foot waves in the Slough. I was in the perfect spot, and got there when the water was slack. Anybody interested in knowing how to figure that one out, just send me an email and I'll be glad to Fax you the info. It's a pretty cool formula. (When at a rendezvous with the BYC, just ask if anybody has ever had trouble getting into the dock at LaConner, let alone the reciprocal dock for the Swinomish YC. Then sit back and listen to Boating Horror Stories. Be sure to fix yourself something to drink before you ask the question, cause you don't want to miss any of these stories. You could even have a prize for the the best one. I'll do it at the Past Commodores Cruise if I an make it.)

TWIN SCREW POWERBOAT TRAINING FOR BYC MEMBERS



On Saturday, May 22, beginning at 9AM (rain date Sunday May 23), BYC Member **Joe Coons** is offering powerboat maneuvering lessons aboard *Skylark II*, his twin screw 43' Tollycraft. We'll spend the morning maneuvering around the harbor including lots of docking, and we'll discuss and practice the "tough" situations like "how to get away when the wind is blowing", etc. The training will be for novices, as well as those who want to get some hints, and is limited to no more than six members, first come, first served!
