CLUB MEMBERSHIP PROMOTION EVENTS SCHEDULED 1/17 & 3/24...

The BYC is holding two events to expose the Club to the public and encourage membership and more, safer boating.

The first event, a Club Open House is set for Wednesday, January 17, from 5:30 – 7:30. This reception will receive heavy advertising in the Bellingham Herald beginning December 31, and the schedule will include refreshments, tours of our facilities, and extensive handouts. Most important, however, will be attendance by our Club's leaders to personally host the visitors who come to this event so that visitors will be made comfortable and their questions answered, but this is not a "Club Social"! We especially want some power and sail boaters on hand. Our liquor license only allows this kind of "public" event once a year, so it is important. If you can help, call Joe Coons or Geoff Chamness (numbers below) and let us know you'll be there. Thanks.

The second event will be a day of Boating Seminars on Saturday, March 24. From 9:00 am until around 4:30, boaters and prospective boaters will attend seminars about buying, selling, maintaining, and chartering boats; and about cruising locally, to Desolation Sound and Alaska; junior sailing; racing, and more. At a sandwich-bar lunch, discussion tables will be arranged so that folks can learn more and ask questions. There will be a charge for these events, with Members paying \$10 per person for lunch, non-Members paying \$30 for an individual or \$50 for a couple including lunch. This day will also be heavily advertised in the Herald.

After the Seminar Day, on April 7, 8, 14, or 15 depending on weather attendees will be invited to spend a half day on the water with BYC members. Please consider participating with your boat in this program! You will take folks out from approximately 9 am to noon, or 1 pm to 4, give them some "wheel time", and introduce them to safety and fun on the water. BASIC RACE MANAGEMENT SEMINAR TO BE HELD ...

On Saturday, February 3rd, 2007, at the Bellingham Yacht Club, a seminar sponsored by the US SAILING Race Management Committee and US Sailing Area H will be held. It is designed for people with some race committee experience, and newcomers, who wish to become certified under US Sailing's race officer certification program as a US Sailing Club Race Officer. The program will begin at 0800 and end at 1730.

The topics to be covered include: race committee objectives, competition formats, sailing instructions, race committee jobs, race committee equipment, race day preparations, setting the course, starts, during the race, finishing, post-race responsibilities, and scoring.

The principal instructor for this seminar will be **Leslie Keller**. Leslie is a US Sailing Regional Race Officer and the Area H Race Officer.

At the seminar, you will need your own copy of the *Racing Rules of Sailing* ("RRS") and you will be given a copy of Join the Race Committee Team. People who register will be asked to complete a set of race management study questions prior to attending the seminar.

The Club Race Officer Certification Test will be given at the end of the seminar and is optional. However, to be certified as a <u>US Sailing Club Race Officer</u> under US Sailing's race officer certification program, you must attend a complete basic seminar and pass the test. You will also need to have your own copy of the current US Sailing Race Management Handbook and meet the program's other criteria. An application for certification will be provided to each participant in this seminar.

The fee for this seminar is listed below and includes the following: continental breakfast, refreshments for an afternoon break, lunch, all seminar materials, your own copy of *Join the Race Committee Team*, instruction, and administration of the test. The schedule for this

program is the following: 0800 Registration and continental breakfast; 0830 Seminar begins; 1200 Lunch; 1645 Test; 1715 Test Debriefing; 1730 Seminar Concludes.

Advance Registration is Required! To register, send your check for \$50 (\$55 for non-US SAILING members) payable to the Bellingham Yacht Club, 2625 South Harbor Loop, Bellingham, WA 98225, by January 15, 2007. You may also register on our secure web site at www.byc.org. Include with your registration your name, address, telephone number, fax number, e-mail address, and indicate whether or not you will take the certification test. RBAW REPORT

The BYC is a supporting member of the Recreational Boating Association of Washington [as every individual member should be as well...Ed] and member **BJ Ursin** represents us at its meetings, and files the following report...

The Washington Mandatory Boater Education Law goes into effect <u>January 1, 2007</u>, and by <u>January 1, 2008</u> all operators of boats with 15hp engines or larger, who are 20 years old or younger, will be required to have obtained and carry a Washington State Boater Education card under the phase-in of the law.

Even if you and or your children are not yet required to have the card yet, start planning now so the necessary course can be completed in time to have the card when your age group phases-in.

To qualify for a card, have your 20 or under child (or relative, neighbor, etc.) take a basic boating course through the United States Power Squadron, Coast Guard Auxiliary, or on-line on the internet. The phase-in will eventually affect all boaters born after December 31, 1954. If you have questions go to http://www.parks.wa.gov/boating/boatered.asp.

The ISLAND TIDES quotation I brought up last night was "hoax" article written by an overzealous writer. The RCMP will enforce reckless boating activities such as speeding in speed-controlled areas, however, possession of spirits onboard is legal as long as the boater is operating his/her vessel unimpaired by over-consumption.
