2007 ETCHELLS WRAP-UP

The Bellingham Bay Etchells Fleet held its 2007 season wrap-up and awards meeting in December. After 31 races in five series, the top 4 boats were separated by only 5 points. Five Five Two, sailed by John Pedlow, Tom Malone and Craig Cooper took the overall trophy by one point over Pete Ambrose's Attitude. Following close behind in third and fourth were Randy Nulle's Voodoo and Terry Hileman's Beauzeau.

The Five Five Two team also qualified to represent the Bellingham fleet in the 2008 Etchells World Championships which will be sailed in Chicago in June.

Fleet officers for the upcoming year are Co-Captains John Pedlow and Bill Green; the Treasurer is Mary Davis. Craig Cooper and Rex Broward will be heading up fleet development. As a part of that effort, they will be organizing several "get acquainted" races to give local sailors the opportunity to experience the Etchells.

The International Etchells class is active in 11 countries around the world. In the US, there are 28 active fleets with almost 1000 boats sailing. In Bellingham, this past season, 12 boats competed in the fleet events, including boats from Seattle, Alaska and Victoria. Over the past few years, our fleet members have competed in championship regattas in San Diego, Gulf Harbour, New Zealand and San Francisco.
