Registration for the parade will be on Friday and Saturday from 3:30 to 5:00 PM. In order to participate for an award one will need to register your boat on Friday and receive a number. There is no registration fee. Boats away will be at 1800 on Friday to accommodate the Alaska Ferry scheduled departure at 1800 from the Bellingham Cruise Terminal. NOVEMBER 2009 RBAW NEWS



Starting in September 2009 a five dollar (\$5) fee was automatically added to the cost of vehicle license tabs. This fee is to help support State Parks and does not go to the State General Fund but direct to State Parks. This fee is considered a donation and motorist have the option to "opt-out" and not pay the fee. Boaters are encouraged not to "opt-out". RBAW support this fee and recommends motorists not to "opt out".

Boaters Urged to Comment on Proposed NOAA Restrictions

If you've been watching the local news lately, you've heard that new restrictions are being considered to keep the Northwest's whale population from allegedly being harmed by boaters, fishermen, kayakers and whale-watching tourists. Representatives of these groups have turned out in force to oppose a federal NOAA plan to protect killer whales by closing off 6.2 square miles of water off San Juan Island each year.

RBAW agrees that saving the Orca whales is necessary and worth doing. We however are unanimously opposed to the regulations and restrictions being proposed by NOAA.

State Budget

(The final budgets were not kind to boaters. There are some silver linings, but the clouds are very dark. The Recreation Resource Account (Boater Gas Tax Refund Account) was used to fund State Parks, as was the NOVA (Off Road Vehicle Recreation) account. Combined, that was just under \$19.4 million □ of which just over \$9.8 million was boater funds. In return, boaters received nothing of immediate value. Clearly this was a raid on our Boater Gas Tax Refund Account.

(The barely silver linings: First, with the Recreation Resource Account funds (gas tax refund acct.) going to State Parks and not the general fund, and being credited for the maintenance and operation of the marine and waterfront parks, these funds will probably still count for federal purposes in determining our federal allocations for our State Boating Programs. The second barely silver lining: Legislators are bothered that boaters were not treated well, and want to try and fix things □ although that is only future good will, and not an immediate good deed.

PHRF UPDATE

We have exciting news at PHRF NW! Previously, the high cost of processing credit card payments prevented PHRF from offering this as a payment option. PHRF NW had elected to keep the membership fees low and accept only checks for payments. This has changed! In response to the membership's requests, we found a way to make this work; you can now join or renew your membership via our website. No more looking for the dusty checkbook, digging for a stamp and remembering to put it in the mail. We have made it much simpler for members. Please check us out our new website at www.phrf-nw.org. CAPTAINS LICENSING RETURNS TO BYC

Capt. Richard Rodriguez has announced that he will conduct courses for the seventh year in Bellingham. This year's course will begin January 4, 2010. The past six years Rodriguez has qualified hundreds of Coast Guard Masters (Captains) in the San Juans. Graduates are working in a variety of positions.

Hundreds of Zenith Maritime graduates operate vessels throughout the world and received their licenses through our approved training as an alternative to stressful Coast Guard Examinations.

Captain Richard Rodriguez has been the primary Vessel Assist Responder in the San Juans for a number of years and brings real world situations to the classroom. He works professionally over 150 days a year in local waters.

This year's course will be held on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday evenings from 5:30 pm - 9:30 pm. Jan. 4 - Feb. 24, 2010 in the Ward Room.

A number of BYC members have earned their Captain's Licenses with Capt. Rodriguez. BYC Members qualify for a 20% discount off the \$1,300 tuition.
