JUNIOR SAILING REPORT:

June was a successful month for the BYC's summer youth sailing program thanks to the efforts of dedicated volunteers and two *great* sailing instructors: **Katie Bury** and **Calla Ward**. Twenty-two kids graduated from the first two basic sailing classes during June, and many of them will attend the first intermediate level class starting June 30. The program is very popular with kids and their parents, and many graduates have expressed an interest in continuing to learn sailing.

Spread the Word: The BYC's youth sailing classes run until Labor Day weekend. Classes are one week long and provide students 30 hours of learning and fun. Each class is Monday through Friday 9:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. Beginning and intermediate level classes are available and cost \$169. COMMODORE'S COLUMN...

Greetings everyone! Mother Nature still seems to be keeping us guessing as to whether or not we will have a summer this year. Personally, I am looking forward to warmer temperatures, more sunshine and turning off the furnace in my house.

Have you ever thought about whether the Club is providing what you as a member want from a Yacht Club? How do you envision BYC in 10 or 15 years? Do you see us in the same building or relocated to a new facility in the Georgia Pacific redevelopment area? Would you like to see the Club keep the current building, but expand upward another story? These thoughts have crossed my mind and I found myself revisiting our Club Mission Statement:

"The mission of the Bellingham Yacht Club is to foster recreational boating activities in Bellingham and vicinity by providing a support organization run by volunteers, a clubhouse, and other facilities and equipment, and to serve the social needs of its members to the extent possible while managing the Club's assets in a fiscally responsible manner. Objectives in Support of the Club Mission will be formulated by the Board and published in its minutes and other places."

While I believe that the Board is doing a

good job adhering to this mission statement, something that I have noticed during my years of involvement as a member of the Board of Directors is that the club does not have a formal long-range planning committee. I touched on this issue in a Board meeting earlier this year and the issue was again revisited in this last meeting. During the ensuing discussion, we talked about the need to have consistency of membership in the committee due to the long-term nature of the issues in which the committee will be engaged. **Troy Curran** volunteered to organize and chair a long-range planning committee. He will be looking for two or three other interested active members with the qualifications and commitment necessary to serve a five plus year term on the committee. Some of the issues the committee will be tackling will be membership growth, club facilities and fleet assets. Our first session of Youth Sailing Lessons finished last Friday with raves from the participants and their parents...so much so that the parents were asking when they could enroll their kids in the next open session. I want to applaud **Steve Kersey** for his tenacity in getting the program rolling this year. He has done most of the work organizing and publicizing the classes. In addition, **Brennan Ashton** has been a terrific help in organizing the boats and assisting the instructors we hired who are both members of the Western Washington University sailing team. They are both well qualified and are excellent with the kids. Thanks to everyone involved...this is one of the best ways we can fulfill our Club mission statement to foster recreational boating activities in Bellingham.

I am pleased to inform all of you that the new safety boat that we purchased last year is exceeding our expectations. Not only is it an excellent boat for coaching the Youth Sailing

program, but it is also an excellent safety boat which is very stable in choppy conditions is excellent for approaching and assisting overturned boats. With a little TLC, the boat should give us many years of useful service. Thanks to **Steve Hayward**, the RIB now has the BYC logo and letters applied to both sides. This is just another example of how all the volunteers help to keep the club running.

That was the good news, now the bad. Our Mark Boat is approaching the end of its useful life. Last winter we received a kit from the manufacturer to reinforce the bows as they are not strong enough for the heavy use they have been receiving in our choppy conditions. The bows have been flexing, causing cracking and subsequent leaking. We contracted to have the reinforcement kit installed last winter, but the contractor said that the hull was too thin for him to install the kit without major re-plating of the bottom due to salt water corrosion. Instead of spending the money at that time, **Pete Foti** examined the hull and determined that if we repaired the existing major cracks, that it should be safe for this summer's use. Troy Curran and **Geoff Chamness** applied additional patches and bottom painted the boat, but it is again leaking pretty badly. The good news is that the Honda engine is in excellent shape and while the boat should last the season, we are looking for a suitable used hull for replacement, hopefully one that is more stable in strong winds and choppy conditions while setting and retrieving marks.

WINE TASTING PARTY...BACK BY POPULAR DEMAND!

For those of you who did not attend our second Wine Tasting Party the evening of June 13th, you missed a great event. Our thanks go to

Everyone had a fantastic time sampling the delicious local wines and listening to great music. The nominal price of \$10 was well worth it just for the privilege of enjoying jazz provided by Paul Kline, and Mark Kelly (The Brothers 'K') from the Atlantics and there was plenty of food and good wines. Many of those in attendance used the opportunity to take advantage of the great prices and stock up their personal cellars.

ATTENTION AT THE BAR PLEASE!!

We continue to have problems with the cash register at the bar. There are two reasons: (1) many of our bartenders, due to infrequency of tending the bar, forget or have never properly learned how to use the register. (2) Customers don't pay to much attention to credit card slips, receipts, or don't use their membership card when making a purchase. As a result we see wrong tips being rung up, payments without members' names being attached, and customers coming back later to say that they are being charged for something that they never consumed.

Most of the time we sort out these problems, but sometimes we cannot. To give you an example, someone was charged on his/her credit card \$250 instead of \$2.50. We do not know who that person is, but will gladly refund the amount. Members, better check your credit card statement!

At the last Board meeting it was agreed that: (1) bartenders should be more careful particularly with tip entry, and that all payments from customers should be entered using the card membership card; (2) if customers come back with a complaint about being charged for incorrect items or double charging etc., and we cannot find the charges against the customer's name, there will be NO REFUND by the Club. 2008/09 BYC ELECTIONS COMING

Elections for the 2008/09 year will be held in September. Every year, four of the eight Board Member terms expire and new Trustees need to be elected, as well as the flag officers. While any qualified active member can be elected to any flag officer position, it is generally been our tradition, as suggested by our bylaws, that each flag officer moves up in succession to the next position. This is done so that by the time a person reaches Commodore they will have had the experience of having fulfilled the duties of all the flag officer positions and thus are better qualified to lead the Club. As you may recall, this year we added the requirement of having been a member of the Board for at least one year before an active member is eligible for election to the position of Fleet Captain as that is a an important role with many responsibilities.

Each year, a nominating committee consisting of two Past Commodores and three active members is appointed by the incumbent Commodore to solicit candidates for members of the Board to fill the vacated positions. NEW POLICY FOR MEMBERSHIP SPONSORSHIP

Approved by the Board 6/19/08.

As a new member applicant sponsor, when you sign their application you are volunteering to be the applicant's sponsor for one year. Both signing sponsors are responsible for introducing

the new member into the club, for a period of one year, by actively promoting all club functions with the new member. Signatory sponsors should make every effort to introduce the new member to several club members within the first few months of membership. Sponsors do not have to attend all club events, but should extend invitations to new members and encourage their involvement. The goal of new member sponsorship is to promote membership longevity through active members that feel comfortable and welcome in the club. There is no limit on new member sponsorship.

The reason for this policy change: Our Club has gained many new members but has often not kept them into the second year! Many new members feel uncomfortable when they are in the club and they also feel that they are unaware of club events.

THE SAILING FOUNDATION

Hi. My name is Jeff Davis and this winter I joined the board of the Sailing Foundation. It's been an organization that's been part of the Northwest sailing scene since the Intrepid America's cup campaign in the 70's. It's currently enjoying a revival with new goals, people and energy. I hope you'll take a minute to read what we are up to and consider joining.

The Sailing Foundation is a non-profit organization dedicated to the promotion of sailing in the Pacific Northwest. Its missions are to bring more youth into our sport, to increase the racing expertise of young sailors, and to promote safety at sea.

The Foundation promotes and enhances youth sailing by (1) supporting high school and college sailing teams - particularly for travel to their national championships each year, (2) supporting purchases of fleets of dinghies used for training youth and for competition between high schools, and (3) supporting WIND, a clinic for youth sailors held every summer in strong winds and hot sun at the Columbia Gorge.

In the 1980s, the Foundation's Safety at Sea Committee noted the absence of appropriate man overboard rescue devices on racing keelboats. After a period of several years of research and trials, this committee developed the "Life Sling", the Coast Guard-certified man overboard recovery system widely used to this day aboard racing and cruising sailboats worldwide. Royalties from the production of the Life Sling continue to provide funding for the Foundation's safety at sea program. The Safety at Sea Committee is involved in on-going research and development of tools to enhance boating safety for all types of sailors and periodically hosts Safety at Sea Seminars for ocean cruisers and racers.

The Foundation's 2008 Safety at Sea Seminar was held in Seattle on February 9th and 10th at the old Naval Reserve Armory at the South end of Lake Union. This US SAILING-

sanctioned event was moderated by Chuck Hawley and featured special new sections on survival in cold water, medical emergencies at sea and the latest sources of weather information. The seminar received high marks from over 120 cruisers, including many Vic-Maui competitors and many others who are planning extended offshore cruises.

In 1974 Sunny Vynne led the Intrepid campaign - the first Seattle-based effort to win the right to sail for the America's Cup. After that campaign ended, Intrepid was sold and the proceeds funded the Foundation's work for the next quarter century. Now that those funds have been spent, support for the Foundation's programs comes from donations from local sailors and from royalties earned by the Life Sling.

The Sailing Foundation is working through community-based sailing organizations, local high schools and universities, and yacht clubs, to increase the flow of new sailors into our sport and to develop their competitive expertise. And once they're out on the water, our Safety at Sea Committee, through product development and education, works to protect sailors in all types of sailing craft as they continue to enjoy

We all must be asking what we can do to bring back an interest in racing by youth.

If we want to have the sport continue we will need new young sailors competing in our races and we will want the best safety gear for our boats. To promote these goals, I encourage you to make an annual contribution to The Sailing Foundation. Support at the \$50 level will buy a session of expert coaching for a high school team. Support at the \$500 level will send a college sailor to a national championship. This year the Foundation helped the WWU team attend the Women's Collegiate National Championship.
