BYC YOUTH FLEET NEWS:

Registration is now open for the BYC's summer 2009 youth sailing classes. Classes will fill quickly so don't wait to register your child or grandchild for the BYC's summer sailing program.

Each BYC youth sailing class is Monday through Friday from 9:00 - 4:00, and features low student to instructor ratios. Sessions can be combined to create multi-week learning experiences. The cost for a single-session enrollment is \$169. Discounts for enrolling a student in two or more sessions are available. The enrollment fee covers instruction, boat usage and materials. Students enrolled in BYC youth sailing classes must demonstrate basic swimming ability to class instructors.

Basic Sailing: No sailing or boating experience required. Learn to sail a basic boat in fair weather conditions through a combination of on-shore instruction, on the water practice, and plenty of fun and games.

- Session 1: June 22 - 26
- Session 2: June 29 - July 3
- Session 3: July 13 - 17
- Session 4: August 3 - 7
- Session 5: August 17 - 21

Intermediate Sailing: Prerequisite: BYC basic sailing or equivalent. We'll help you take sailing to the next level. Students hone their sailing skills and develop an ability to sail in more varied conditions. This class features more time on the water, fun and games, and an introduction to sailboat racing.

- Session 1: July 6 - 10

- Session 2: July 20 - 24
- Session 3: August 10 - 14
- Session 4: August 24 - 28

NEW! Advanced Sailing. Prerequisite: BYC intermediate sailing or equivalent. This hands-on class further increases sailing abilities and prepares students for high school and collegiate team level sailboat racing.

- Session 1: July 27 - 31
- Session 2: August 31 - September 4

NEW MEMBER POLICY:

Volunteer members are the life blood of the Bellingham Yacht Club. In order to ensure new members feel more welcome and to encourage participation in Club activities, the Membership Committee has presented the following changes to the BYC Policy Section of the Member Yearbook to the Board, and the Board has adopted the new policies and procedures as set forth below.

To SECTION IV, MEMBERSHIP POLICIES & PROCEDURES, we have added the following subsection:

C. New Members

1. The Rear Commodore will act as Membership Committee co-chairperson along with one Active or Senior member of the club. The Rear Commodore's duties will be to oversee the committee in order to ensure consistent communication with new members.

2. Sponsorships - Sponsors will assume an active role by taking responsibility for new members for their first year of membership. The goal is to ensure new members feel welcome, get to know other members and become involved in one or more of the various committees. Specific sponsorship responsibilities will be added to the New Member Application so sponsors are reminded of them when they sign the application.

3. Name Badges - Badge colors will be changed to reflect membership status. New member badges, except non-resident members, will be silver with black lettering. Upon completing one year of membership, the new member will receive a gold badge with black

lettering. Non-resident member badges will be blue with white lettering. A quantity of "Host" badges (white badge with blue Lettering) will be available in the badge area for sponsors and anyone else wishing to act as a host during club functions.

4. Communication - Upon Board acceptance of a new member, the Rear Commodore is responsible for the initial contact to welcome the new member. The Membership Committee is then responsible for quarterly follow-up calls to ensure the member's needs are being met.

5. Jib Sheet and Web Site - The Jib Sheet and BYC Web Site will be enhanced to spotlight new members and provide more information about them.

6. Recognition - New members and one-year members will be recognized on a regular basis either at Friday's at Five or in a separate membership event. This recognition will include a ceremony to present their permanent name badge at their one-year anniversary.

7. New Member Social - At the discretion of the Rear Commodore, there will be a new member social event held twice a year.
