## BYC YOUTH SAILING REPORT:

### Program Status:

The BYC's summer sailing program has received more than 125 student enrollment registrations. About 90% of this year's available registrations have been filled, and the remaining open registrations are filling-up fast. Please contact Steven Kersey at 360-969-0092 if you want to enroll your child or grandchild in a BYC summer sailing class.

### Good News:

Revenue for the 2009 BYC Youth Sailing program has increased strongly compared to last year and now exceeds \$21,000. The program likely will be profitable this year even in the midst of a major economic downturn.

### 2009 Class Schedule:

#### Basic Sailing:

No sailing or boating experience required. Learn to sail a basic boat in fair weather conditions through a combination of on-shore instruction, on the water practice, and plenty of fun and games.

- Session 1: June 22 - 26 (Class Full - Closed)
- Session 2: June 29 - July 3 (Class Full - Closed)
- Session 3: July 13 - 17 (Class Full - Closed)
- Session 4: August 3 - 7 (Class Full - Closed)
- Session 5: August 17 - 21 (Class Full - Closed)

#### Intermediate Sailing:

Prerequisite: BYC basic sailing or equivalent. We'll help you take sailing to the next level. Students hone their sailing skills and develop an ability to sail in more varied conditions. This class features more time on the water, fun and games, and an introduction to sailboat racing.

- Session 1: July 6 - 10 (Class Full - Closed)
- Session 2: July 20 - 24 (Class Full - Closed)
- Session 3: August 10 - 14 (Class Full - Closed)
- Session 4: August 24 - 28.

#### NEW! Advanced Sailing:

Prerequisite: BYC intermediate sailing or equivalent. This hands-on class further increases sailing abilities and prepares students for high school and collegiate team level sailboat racing.

- Session 1: July 27 - 31
- Session 2: August 31 - September 4.

#### BYC Instructor in Training Program:

Students completing intermediate level sailing classes can help teach BYC sailing classes through the instructor in training program. The BYC's current group of highly capable instructors in training includes Lily Grimshaw, Amber Curran, and Hanna Birdsong. Additional

### **Tuesday Night Dinghy Races:**

### **Report From the BYC's Sailing Instructors:**

The number of youth sailors racing on Tuesday nights is growing fast, and we have two regattas planned for them this summer. The third annual Bellingham Junior Sailing Regatta is scheduled for the end of August, and will be held at WWU's Lake Whatcom facility. It will be fully staffed by Western Washington University sailors who will be doing on the water coaching. On August 15th and 16th, about ten of the BYC's youth sailors will be traveling to Seattle for the McCurdy Cup team-racing regatta held by the Seattle Yacht Club. This group of kids has been practicing racing Sunday afternoons on Lake Whatcom for more than a month, and they are eager to compete in Seattle.

The instructor in training program is developing seasoned sailors who provide valuable assistance to myself, and my fellow instructor Katie Stackpole. They help rig boats, demonstrate sailing, coach students, and set race courses. The past month has been a great success for the BYC's youth sailing program. Thank you to all the BYC members who have helped the youth sailing program grow and become successful. Thanks also to my co-instructor Katie who is constantly brainstorming with me about how we can improve the program. This is a new column where BYC members anonymously contribute a story on an experience they have had on their boat or someone else's. Perhaps sharing our most embarrassing moments on our boats can both provide a laugh and a learning experience for others too. Contributions may be made to either of our editors and are always strictly confidential.

**#1** Always mark your 'Crab Catch Card' immediately after you have collected your crab. You cannot re-bait your pot if you are going to continue crabbing or start the boat to leave. The fine

is over \$100 and the judge is unable to reduce it regardless of your excuse.

**#2** Give serious consideration to always lowering your sails and starting your engine when pulling up to your crab pot. Or at least not trying to do it when 'single handing' your boat.

**#3** Never get let your boat drift over the crab pot rope. Getting it out from under your keel or rudder may be very challenging. This is especially true when considering **#2** above.
